Also presented on the night was the Binney Medal, which is awarded to the person whose nomination stands out as exceptional above the others. The Binney Medal is in remembrance of Sir Ralph Binney, a retired naval captain who died while trying to stop an armed robbery. This year the Binney Medal was presented to Teresa Locke from Kent (see image below), also a gold medal winner, who intervened when she saw a man overpowering a teenage girl. The man assaulted Teresa as she tried to fight him off the girl but she continued her attack on him unrelenting. The man later received a custodial sentence of 36 months. The public-spirited nature of the individuals recognised at the awards is something we would all like to see more of. For 2022, 16-year-old Nitin Singh from Uttarakhand, who displayed outstanding bravery in fighting a leopard, was awarded the Markandeya award.Under the ICCW's Prahlad awards, Uttam Tanti, who saved two lives from drowning bagged the award for 2020, while Ayush Ganesh Tapkir from Maharashtra also saved two lives from drowning, was also awarded under the same category for 2021, the statement said.The Eklavya award was given to Amandeep Kaur, who saved four children who were trapped in a burning vehicle, Angel Maria Jyom from Kerala, who saved a child from drowning and Sitaram Yadav from Chhattisgarh who with his valiant efforts, saved a life.Kaur narrated the incident and said she did not even think twice before taking the decision. "When I grow up, I want to become a police officer and continue saving lives," she said.The Abhimanyu awards were given to 15-year-old Shant who saved a man from drowning in a raging river, 13-year-old Shanis Abdulla TK who saved his mother from a buffalo attack, the statement said. The Shravan Awards were to Kusum from Punjab for fighting mobile scamsters, Pratish Sudhakar Mane from Maharashtra who sacrificed his life to save his mother from electrocution and Jyotsana Kumar who displayed a grit and determination to fearlessly fight off a bear. It added, Kusum said she hopes the award will inspire for others and motivate them in future.The Bharat award 2020 was conferred posthumously to Late Cadet Amit Raj who sacrificed his life while saving two children from being burnt to death.The 'National Awards for Bravery' was started by ICCW to give due recognition to the children who distinguish themselves by performing outstanding deeds of bravery and meritorious service and to inspire other children to their example. Here are their awesome stories. New Delhi witnessed the gathering of some of India's bravest children on January 24, when Prime Minister Narendra Modi presented the National Bravery Awards to them. From a 16-year-old who fought off a tiger, to a 13-year-old who lost his life while trying to save his friend from drowning - these three girls and 22 boys showed incredible bravery in the face of some very dangerous situations. "For the award winners, this act of bravery should not become an end in itself. Life must continue to evolve and the children should continue to develop their careers and continue to serve society to the best of their abilities," the Prime Minister told them during the event. Advertisement The National Bravery Award scheme, initiated by the Indian Council for Child Welfare (ICCW), was started with the aim of rewarding children in the age group of 6-18 years, who display outstanding bravery to inspire other children with their actions. The awards consist of five categories including the Bharat Award, Sanjay Chopra Award, Geeta Chopra Award, Bapu Gaidhani Award and the General National Bravery Awards. The awardees receive a medal, certificate and a cash prize. Bharat Award winners get a gold medal, while the others receive a silver. Showing extraordinary presence of mind, she pushed two students out of the window and jumped off the bus herself too. Her younger brother sustained severe injuries, but he has recovered now. 16 students, the driver, and the conductor lost their lives in that accident. She was honoured with the Geeta Chopra award. "It feels good to have the limelight and get an award from the Prime Minister. But I wish I was able to save my sister, too, as we all miss her," she told the Indian Express. 2. Arjun Singh, Uttarakhand Advertisement In July 2014, a tiger entered 16-year-old Arjun Singh's house in Uttarakhand. He showed extreme courage and fought it off, saving his mother's life who had fainted as soon as the tiger entered. Arjun went into a room and picked up a sickle to fight the tiger. As it was too small to hit from a distance, Arjun grabbed a stick and waved it towards the tiger. He did not stop until the villagers reached there and the animal ran away on seeing the crowd. Muhammad Muhsin - A 16-year-old boy from Kerala's Kozhikode district drowned while trying to save three of his friends from rough seas in April last year. He has been posthumously selected for the ICCW Abhimanyu Award. Aditya K. - Another 15-year-old Kerala resident was awarded the Bharat Award as he saved over 40 lives when they were setting fire to a bus that was caught in Nepal in May 2019. Aditya later told media personnel that he eventually wanted to join the Indian Air Force. Sartaj Mohideen Mughal and Mudasir Ashraf - two youths from Jammu and Kashmir from Kupwara and Budgam respectively - were awarded last year for their display of gallantry in the former state. Ashraf attempted to rescue Kefayet Hussain who had crashed an IAF Mi-17 helicopter in Budgam in February 9. Caroline Malaswamitangi - Malasawmatilungi lives in Mizoram. The girl has been awarded gallantry award for her presence of mind which saved a child from being kidnapped. Kamal Krishna Das - In September 2018, Das jumped into the flooded Brahmaputra river in Assam to save his mother, aunt and a stranger. Rakhi - 10-year-old Rakhi was given the ICCW Markandeya Award. Ho hailing from Uttarakhand saved her 4-year-old brother from a leopard attack. She was seriously injured in the act. Mrs. Badra - 10-year-old Badra was awarded the ICCW Prahlad Award as she saved her friend who lost her right leg and nearly lost her life on a railway track in November 2018. National Child Bravery Award 2018 Winners: The Prime Minister of India, Narendra Modi presented the National Bravery Awards to 18 children selected from different parts of the country on 24 January 2018. These children were selected by the Indian Council for Child Welfare (ICCW) for this honor from across the country. The National Bravery Award Scheme was initiated by the ICCW in 1957 to recognize children who have distinguished themselves by their exceptional gallantry deeds and meritorious service. This award is given every year to brave children having high spirits and indomitable courage. The age of these children is between 06 years to 18 years. A total of 18 children will be awarded the National Child Bravery Award this year, which includes 7 girls and 11 boys. National Bravery Award 2018 Winner List: India Awards: This award is the highest award for gallantry. This award has been given to 16-year-old Nazia from Agra Uttar Pradesh. Raised voice against illegal gambling and betting bases going on for 40 years in Mantola area of Agra city of Uttar Pradesh. All the residents and shopkeepers of the area were terrorized by this illegal work, but Nazia raised her voice without any fear. Nazia gathered evidence against this illegal work and sent four people to jail. But after that the miscreants turned more against him. Nazia found it difficult to leave the house and her house was attacked. His family members start thinking of selling their house and going somewhere far away. Jia refused to leave the house. Now he directly tweeted (July 2016) directly to the Chief Minister of UP. What was Minister’s National Child Award. Karanbir wants to become a police officer when he grows up. She has been awarded the Sanjay Chopra Award. Please tell that Karanbir was from Punjab. Babu Gaidhani Award: Mamta Dalai, only six years old, fought a crocodile and saved her sister’s life. This incident happened on 06 April 2017 in Odisha for which he was given the Babu Gaidhani Award. On 10 July 2016, Pankaj Semwal saved his mother’s life from a leopard in Tehri Garhwal, Uttarakhand. In order to save his mother, Pankaj clashed with Guldar and with the help of a wood, drove him away from the house. Pankaj’s mother was injured in this incident. Awarded Gallantry Award for brave and patient bravery of Pankaj. On July 1, 2016, Samridhni was alone at home when a thief broke into the house. But Samridhi confronts the armed thief and drives him out of the house. Samridhi was also injured in this courageous action. Rajeshwari: 13-year-old Rajeshwari saved her aunt and cousin from drowning by giving her life, but gave her life. The incident happened on 10 November 2016 in Manipur.
