Alternate Player for Twitch.tv Extension Offers Enhanced Viewing Experience: The extension provides an alternative player for live broadcasts on Twitch.tv, with numerous benefits including reduced playback interruptions, instant replay options, and ad-blocking capabilities. Key features include:

- Adjusting player settings to match internet connection speed
- Instant replay with adjustable speed or frame-by-frame option
- Hiding Twitch ads while allowing embedded streamer ads
- "Audio only" mode for music listening
- Automatic bonus point collection in chat
- Customizable chat size and location, including full-screen mode
- Option to disable chat entirely for improved performance

Device selection for audio output and volume control via mouse wheel

- Colorizable player interface and reduced RAM usage
- Rapid start-up times, especially on slower computers
- Ability to continue viewing broadcasts in external players

The extension requires permissions to read and modify data on Twitch-related websites and manage browser extensions. It does not affect video playback and is compatible with Chrome 49, Windows XP, and OS X 10.6. However, it may not function properly in some browsers or on touch screens due to incomplete support. As per Twitch's privacy policy, Alternate Player handles user data responsibly, ensuring it is not shared or used for unrelated purposes.

The technologist Dan Clancy, born January 11, 1964, in New Orleans, Louisiana, has had a diverse career. He held various positions at NASA before becoming Engineering Director for Google Book Search from 2005 to early 2014. Clancy then served as Vice President of Product and Engineering at social networking service Nextdoor from 2014 to 2018. In 2019, he became the president of Twitch Interactive Inc., and in March 2023, he took over as CEO after Emmett Shear's departure. As CEO, Clancy reports directly to Amazon VP Steve Boom. Clancy holds a BA in computer science and theatre from Duke University (1985) and a PhD in artificial intelligence from the University of Texas at Austin. During his studies, he worked at Trilogy, Xerox Webster Research center, and NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory. He has two adult children with his wife Sienna, including Savannah Clancy, a folk singer-songwriter. In his career at NASA, Clancy held various positions, including researcher on Integrated Health Management, autonomy, and robotics (1998), Chief of the Computational Sciences Division (2000-2003), Director of the Exploration Technologies Directorate (2003-2005), and Head of Information Sciences and Technology. He was part of the team that developed NASA's plan to return men to the Moon and eventually Mars. At Google, Clancy worked on International Search Quality and became Engineering Lead for Google Book Search, where he focused on scaling technology and optimizing search results. He also played a key role in negotiating the Google Book Search copyright lawsuit settlement and served as a spokesperson for the company. Dan Clancy is a senior executive at Google and Twitch. He became the Engineering Lead for Google Search Properties in 2008, overseeing all of Google's search products. In 2010, he joined YouTube as Engineering and Product Lead, focusing on search and infrastructure. He later led research teams at Google, including human-computer interaction and machine learning. Clancy has also worked at Nextdoor and Twitch, where he became President and CEO in March 2023, succeeding Emmett Shear.

****Dan Clancy's Career and Twitch**** Dan Clancy has had a successful career in tech, with stints at Google, Nextdoor, and Twitch. He started as an engineer at Google, working on various projects including Google Books, which aimed to digitize all books ever published. In 2014, Clancy joined Nextdoor, a social network for neighbors, as VP of Engineering. After two years, he returned to the tech industry and became President of Twitch Interactive in 2022. Under his leadership, Twitch introduced new revenue sharing models, including a 70-30 split between streamers and the platform. However, this move was met with controversy among some streamers who felt they were being unfairly treated.

****Executive Shuffles at Twitch**** In March 2023, it was announced that Emmett Shear, the previous CEO of Twitch, would be stepping down from his role. Dan Clancy took over as President and Lead of Product, Engineering, and GTM Functions at Twitch. This shake-up led to further changes within the company, including the hiring of Laura Lee as Chief Content Officer from YouTube.

****Controversy Over Streamer Pay**** In September 2022, controversy erupted when it was announced that Twitch would be changing its revenue sharing model for streamers who earned over \$100,000. This move sparked protests among some streamers who felt they were being unfairly treated by the company.

****Twitch Layoffs**** As part of a larger layoff effort at Amazon (Twitch's parent company), it was announced in March 2023 that Twitch would be laying off approximately 400 employees.

****Other Developments**** In June 2023, Twitch introduced a new revenue sharing model for streamers who earned over \$100,000. The model features a 70-30 split between the platform and the streamer, but with some caveats. Drag-and-drop functionality allows you to drop thumbnails from other windows/tabs onto the site and add subsequent streams using the menu (also supporting drag-and-drop). Video timestamping is supported for Twitch and YouTube videos. To specify a start time, use the "t" parameter in links like this: To loop or shuffle videos and playlists, just enable those options in your settings. When adding videos or playlists to a page, consider using the "&loop" and "&shuffle" parameters. For instance, shows shuffled videos on a playlist.

To copy the link to your setup, right-click the link and select "Copy link address" or "Copy link shortcut". On mobile, tap and hold to see the option. Modern web browsers may prevent websites from playing audio automatically to conserve data and respect user preferences. Click to play/unmute players manually or adjust browser settings to enable automatic playback. You might encounter a prompt from Twitch to watch streams directly on their website due to advertising policy conflicts. For now, you need to add the hosting stream manually. Known chat issues include:

1. Chat replay is not available for 3rd-party websites.
2. There's no difference between YouTube video and live stream links, which may result in "video unavailable" chat windows.
3. Facebook live chat is not yet supported on embedded websites.

Additionally, you might experience:

- * Chat dark mode not working; try re-enabling it on the main website or reloading existing chats.
- * Only one chat loading when added; this setting defaults to disabled for slow connections.
- * Audio controls not switching chat; menu controls are required for this feature. Smart auto-unmute works by trying to unmute another player if the current one goes offline. It will also automatically unmute streams that come back online. Default video quality issues may occur, especially with non-Twitch players. Wrong video quality settings might be applied if a stream doesn't support the selected quality. Menu controls like play/pause, mute/unmute, and volume may not work with all embedded players. Twitch clips are an example of unsupported embeds. Video controls can become desynchronized when seeking multiple videos simultaneously due to limitations in these embedded players. Twitch VOD frame skip and play speed features are currently only supported by YouTube. To hide the address bar on mobile devices, zoom in using your fingers, scroll down, then zoom out. The website's link format is as follows: streams go after the website address separated by forward slashes. Chats can be added after, but only if preceded by "/c/". Omitting this parameter will add chats based on the entire URL. Session saving works by storing previous sessions and loading them when you revisit the page. Your streams and chats will be saved so you can pick up where you left off next time you visit the page. If you're loading a specific stream or chat in your browser, it'll use those instead of what's stored on our end. To personalize the menu color, simply find an online color picker tool through Google, choose your preferred hue, and copy its code (in a format like #336699, with or without the '#' symbol). It's suggested to opt for darker tones for better readability.
