## Summer camp lesson plan template

If you're looking for some structure during summer, I've created a fun 5-day summer camp activity that teaches kids camping safety and how-to's through activities and play. Each day has a theme with multiple options to participate, including crafts, worksheets, or hands-on experiences. The DIY Summer Camp activity includes educational camping activities, as kids learn best through play. The lesson plan is based on the Cougar Club B.A.S.E. Program's idea and includes badges and certificates for completing each day's tasks. For Monday's "Prep Day," you can watch a short video on what to pack, discuss with the kids about good and bad spots to pitch a tent, and set up or create your own tent/fort in the house. Optional activities include a packing list printable activity and backyard observation printables. On Tuesday, learn everything about campfires - how to be safe with them, how to build them, and enjoy some fun campfire-themed activities! You can make a real campfire if possible or use pretend play ideas. Get the kids excited with the Spongebob CAMPFIRE song and learn about campfire safety from Smokey the Bear. Wednesday's theme is Wilderness and Hiking, Thursday is Survival and Basic First Aid, and Friday is Leave No Trace and Getting Involved! At the end of each day, kids will earn a badge and certificate. We need to build a campfire! Complete the worksheet for Campfire 101 so we know how to gather materials and put it out properly. If you don't have a real campfire, do some pretend activities with our crafts and games like "Roll a S'more". Our printable guides will also show us how to safely create a campfire using food. Next Wednesday, we learn about safety while exploring outside. We'll go over hiking tips, animal encounters, and what to do if you get lost. I used an article from a SAR (Search and Rescue) dad for our printables. Thursday, we focus on basic things to avoid and first aid for kids. Every area is different, so please fill in this printable sheet with your family's local information. We'll also talk about safety tips like bug spray and sunscreen. Remember to always ask an adult before eating something found outside.
