The difference between "do" and "does" lies in their usage, subject agreement, and grammatical context. The basic rule is to use do with all subjects except for the third-person singular, which requires does. For example: Do your homework. Do not forget to turn off th lights. Do you want to come with us? In contrast, we use does with the third-person singular subject: Does he like pizza? Does she have any siblings? For example, Do you like pizza? and I do not like broccoli. DOES, on th other hand, is used for the third person singular in the present tense. For example, She does not like mushrooms.Do and does can also be used to form questions and negatives in the past tense, but in this case, th base verb DO takes th form DID. For example, Did you go to th party? and I did not see th movie. Using Do vs. Does with Other Auxiliary Verbs Do and does can also be used with other auxiliary verbs to form different tenses, such as the present continuous and the past continuous. For example, I am doing my homework and She was doing her laundry.Do and does can also be used to form negatives and questions in the present perfect tense. For example, I have not done my homework yet and Have you done your laundry? She has done her work already, so she can go home now. But, He doed his homework last night - that doesn't sound right! And, She has did everything already - that's not correct either. The word 'do' means you 'perform, take part in, or achieve something." It's an irregular verb because its past tense conjugations don't end with the standard "-ed" like regular verbs do. Plus, it changes depending on whether the subject is first-person singular (I) or third-person singular (he/she/it). For all third-person present singular subjects, use 'does.' Example: She does the shopping on Wednesdays. And for all first-person singular subjects, use 'do.' Example: I'm about to do the laundry. He did his homework when he got home from school. 'Did' and 'does' are just different tenses we use to show whether something is happening now (present) or happened before (past). The simple past tense of 'do' is 'did' for all subjects, while the past participle form is 'done,' also for all subjects.Word Form Examples Other He did a lot of homework today. He had done a lot of homework before he went out with his friends. "He did a lot of homework today" just talks about something that happened before now. The second sentence, with 'he had done' and the auxiliary verb 'had,' forms the past perfect tense - which shows something that happened before another action in the past.To do is one of those special verbs called auxiliary verbs, along with 'to be' and 'to have.' When you use 'do' in a sentence with another verb, it's probably helping as an auxiliary. We use 'do' to make negatives (do + not), question forms, or make the verb more emphatic.
