Who are all of these people here for? bewildered former NBA player Stephon Marbury asked his companion. Theyre here for you, his host replied. Marburys jaw dropped open. He was stunnedbut he would be even more surprised to know that visit to China would soon turn into a life-changing career move. He fell in love with the country and moved there full time, becoming a key part of the sport there, and leading the Beijing Ducks to a CBA title. BIGGEST MARKET IN THE WORLD But this is NOT a tale of someone moving from being a small fish in a big pond to being a big fish in a small pond. On the contrary, China is now the biggest market for basketball in the world, he says. Basketball is the largest spectator sport in China now, with an audience of over a billion people, said Stephon Marbury, an international star player who now lives in Hong Kong. NBA China has a massive following and its worth US\$5 billion, he told Patrick Tsang On-Yip in an interview on Friday Beyond Spotlights. [link] China is now the biggest basketball market in the world. Stephon Marburys life changed when he moved to China. HUMBLE ORIGINS Known as Starbury, he rose from humble beginnings in the projects in Coney Island, New York, to becoming a major US basketball star. But towards 2009, his career faltered, and so did a business project he ran on the side. Unsympathetic voices in the media and social media criticized him heavily. He was left depressed and even suicidal, as he admitted to reporters at the time. To go from that, to go from America, where I was being ridiculed, I was being spoken of in a bad light, and then to be able to go some place and to receive positive light, it was uplifting, he said. So my love for the country, it grew because of what they did for me. You can watch the interview in full below, or keep reading by scrolling down. Marbury worked hard in China and built a basketball legacy by winning three championships for the city of Beijing. He became head coach of the CBA Beijing Royal Fighters and was awarded honorary citizenship in Beijing. He now lives in Hong Kong. His new home has good energy, he said. The vibe is like a New York kind of vibe. CULTURAL SOFT POWER At the moment, theres a lot of negativity aimed at China from the United States, but the two countries shared a love of sports, which could be a good soft power way to improve things, he said. It connects, the connectivity of basketball. It brings people together all over the world, he told Patrick Tsang. The basketball star was in conversation with Patrick Tsang On-yip. And with the fan base and the love of the game, with NBA China growing and the CBA growing, basketball is a language. Its a language that everyone relates to, everybody can speak the same language. PRIZE POSSESSION To the filming, Marbury brought a medal which was given to him by the government in Beijing, naming him as an honorary citizen. He received a medal, making him an honorary citizen of Beijing. This medal means a lot because it shows going from one place to another place and receiving a high honor for doing something that I love to do, by contributing my spirit to the city and affecting people in a positive light through basketball, he said. He realized how important this was when he realized just how proud his teammates were of him. My teammates, they were so happy and so proud to know that I was not only receiving this, but they know that I feel this way. This is big. This is rare and not easy to get, he said. PEACEFUL CULTURE The culture of China also persuaded him to staythe peacefulness of the people, in particular. But he also loved the way that different generations of family members worked together. Stephon Marbury is now based in Hong Kong. He said he loved the peace, the peace inside of the spirit, and the way how the culture takes care of each other, how the elderly take care of the baby, the grand baby, how gathering for food and enjoying a life together that affected me greatly. NEW FAMILY He came from a background which valued family, so that connected with him strongly. Over the years, his friends in China became like siblings to him, and he was thrilled when they addressed him as brother. And I think that played a big part because my friends became my brothers and my sisters in China, he said. And for us to call each other that, and for us to be able to share that type of love, and to be called that in Chinese culture, its pretty cool, its pretty moving, Hong Kong, which manages to be very Chinese, and yet has a New York vibe, is a great location for this reborn sports star. Over the past decade, the star point guard nicknamed Starbury has felt the love of a nation, brought the first-ever basketball championship (and then two more) to Beijing and truly immersed himself in the local culture. Hes also become an icon and role model for millions of young Chinese ballers.Image via @/WeiboBorn and raised in Brooklyn, New York, Marbury played for two CBA teams the Shanxi Dragons and Foshan Dralions prior to his start with the Beijing Ducks. In his first season with the Ducks, he averaged 25 points per game and eventually led them to a championship over then seven-time champion Guangdong Southern Tigers. Following the championship season, Marbury credited his success to Chinese culture, saying it was one filled with love, compassion and care. Marbury went on to win two more championships with the Ducks and eventually finished his career with the Beijing Fly Dragons in 2018. As a way to immortalize Marbury, a life-size statue of the star player was built in Beijing. He also has his own museum dedicated to his basketball career and a musical (I Am Marbury) and movie (My Other Home) based on his story in China.To sum up Marburys impact on the Beijing Ducks, heres what one Beijinger told Thats during the CBA finals in 2015:Lao Ma (Stephon Marbury) is definitely the backbone of the whole team. The other players as well as all fans of the Ducks appreciate and speak highly of his vital role in the team the team has been so positively influenced by Lao Ma. In victory or defeat, he never gives up and keeps fighting until the last second.Although he has no shortage of supporters, fanatics from opposing teams are less inspired by Marburys play, like Shanghai Sharks super fan Zach Etkind (aka Donnie Does aka The Shark Knight). Once he steps in the Shark Tank, all bridges collapse. Etkind said of Marbury playing against his favorite team on one of his popular vlogs.Marbury has consistently shown an admiration for China and its people. In an exclusive interview with Bleacher Report in 2015, he said, Nothing can compare to my experience in China. My situation is fortunate because I actually love it there and I love it because of the people. For what they did to me, Im forever invested into that country. Living there has been great for me and great for my life. So great, in fact, that Marbury became a permanent resident of China in 2016, becoming the first foreign player to receive Chinas rare green card in the CBAs history. He took to Weibo to express his gratitude, writing, Its a true honor to be part of the capital of China.Image via @Marbury/WeiboAfter retiring in 2018, Marbury made the transition to coaching, and he presently serves as the head coach of the Beijing Royal Fighters.He remains an influential member of communities in Beijing and his home state. During the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, Marbury was working with a Chinese company to sell 10 million masks to Brooklyn at cost at a time when masks were increasingly difficult (and expensive) to acquire. It echoes what Marbury is so often about helping out those in need.While hes certainly made himself a lot of money playing the game of basketball and developing his brand into a moneymaker, hes also the same guy who sold a solid, stylish basketball sneaker at a low cost so people could afford it.
