To apply for a Thai visa, submit your application through our 17 official agents from Monday to Friday between 09:00 AM and 11:30 AM. Alternatively, you can self-submit your application during the same time frame. What types of visas are available? Thailand offers Tourist Visa (Single Entry / Multiple Entries), Transit Visa (Single Entry / Double Entries / Triple Entries), and Non-Immigrant Visa (Single Entry / Multiple Entries) for purposes such as Business Visa (Non-B) and Educational Visa (Non-ED). Is Visa on Arrival (VOA) applicable? Unfortunately, VOA is not available for Pakistan and Afghanistan passports. What is the minimum amount of money required to carry to Thailand? You must have at least 20,000 Thai Baht (approximately 700 USD). Yes, you need to provide a 1-year Bank Statement. Is Police Certificate required? Is Business Visa applicable? Yes, we offer Business Visa (Non-B) for single and multiple entries. Note: Thailand Visa on Arrival is valid for 15 days and is available for holders of a passport issued by one of the countries listed below. This type of visa can only be used for tourism purposes and can be applied for and received on the day of your arrival at all Thailand international airports and most land border crossings. Countries eligible for visa-free entry into Bolivia, Costa Rica, El Salvador, Mexico, Paraguay, and Venezuela are set to join Ethiopia, Namibia, Seychelles, and Tunisia on July 15, 2024. This expansion is part of Thailand's efforts to boost tourism. Visa on Arrival documents must be carefully examined before traveling to Thailand. The required documents include a genuine passport with at least 30 days' validity from the date of arrival. It is also recommended that passports have six months' validity for smooth travel and airline check-in. When applying for Visa on Arrival, travelers need to submit: 1. A valid return or onward journey ticket, ensuring they will leave Thailand within 15 days. 2. One passport-sized photo (4 x 6 cm) taken within the last month. 3. A completed application form with accurate information. 4. A duly filled-in Thailand Digital Arrival Card (TDAC), mandatory from May 1, 2025. The Visa on Arrival fee of 2,000 THB is non-refundable and must be paid in cash upon arrival at airports or border crossings. Only Thai Baht is accepted for payment. To verify their address in Thailand, travelers should provide a hotel or apartment booking. It's advisable to exchange only the necessary amount of currency for visa fees at Suvarnabhumi Airport to avoid poor exchange rates. You will need to show proof of your hotel booking confirmation. If you haven't booked yet, you can easily book through Booking.com or Agoda. To get Visa on Arrival, you also need to have at least 10,000 THB per person or 20,000 THB per family in cash with you for travel expenses during your stay. This might be required by the officer, though it's rare, and failing to show it can cause entry refusal. You can obtain Visa on Arrival if arriving by air, sea, or land through border crossings from Laos, Myanmar, Cambodia, or Malaysia. For more info, check the list of airports, harbors, and border crossings where this is available. For your convenience, you can use an online application system to speed up the process at the airport for an additional fee. This e-Visa on Arrival service is currently only available at one airport through eVOA by VFS Global. If needed, you can also extend your stay in Thailand once by 7 days with a visa extension. This can be done at any Immigration Bureau office in Thailand. It's worth noting that Suvarnabhumi Airport (BKK) is the main entry point for many travelers, and there's an option to use VIP fast-track service to skip the queue. More information on getting Visa on Arrival at BKK airport can be found online. If you're arriving at Don Mueang Airport (DMK), Phuket Airport, or Chiang Mai Airport, there are specific procedures for obtaining your visa at these locations as well. If your country is not listed here, it might be eligible for a free visa-exempt stay. The maximum allowed stay for Visa on Arrival holders is 15 days, so if you need to stay longer, consider applying for a Single-Entry Tourist Visa or Multi-Entry Tourist Visa instead. Thailand has introduced various changes to its Visa on Arrival policy, effective from July 15, 2024. According to this policy, travelers from specific countries can obtain a visa upon arrival at Thai airports and land border crossings for tourism purposes only. These eligible countries include Armenia, Belarus, Cyprus, Georgia, Malta, Romania, Russia, Serbia, Bhutan, China, India, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Saudi Arabia, Taiwan, and Uzbekistan. In addition to these countries, some nations are also eligible for a visa exemption, effective from the same date. These countries include Bulgaria, Cyprus, Georgia, Malta, Romania, Russia, and several others in Asia, America, and Africa. However, it's essential to note that not all of these countries can use the Visa Exemption scheme. For those who still require a visa, they will need to provide specific documents upon arrival, including a valid passport with at least 30 days' validity from the day of entry into Thailand. Some airlines may also require an additional six months' validity on the passport for international travel. Travelers should ensure that they meet all requirements before visiting Thailand and have a return or onward journey ticket to avoid any issues upon arrival. In order to secure your spot, you need to prove that you will leave the country before the visa expires. You must attach a passport-sized photo taken within the last month to your application form. The accepted size is 4 x 6 cm. The Thailand Visa on Arrival application form needs to be fully completed with all required information. For further instructions, refer to Thailand Visa on Arrival Form. Additionally, starting from May 1st, 2025, you must present a completed Thailand Digital Arrival Card (TDAC) that should be submitted online before arrival by air, land, or sea. To get more detailed guidance on the new Thailand TM6 form, check Thailand Digital Arrival Card. The visa fee for Visa on Arrival is 2,000 THB and needs to be paid in cash at the airport or border crossing with Thai Baht only. Before arriving at Bangkok Suvarnabhumi Airport, it's recommended to exchange money only for paying the visa fee near the Visa on Arrival as rates might vary. You'll need to provide a hotel booking confirmation to prove your address in Thailand. A proof of sufficient funds for travel expenses (10,000 THB per person or 20,000 THB per family) is necessary when applying for Visa on Arrival. While not often asked, it's better to be prepared as lacking this amount can result in refusal of entry to Thailand. You can get a visa if arriving by air, sea, or land through border crossings from Laos, Myanmar, Cambodia, and Malaysia. For further information, check the list of international airports, harbours, and land border crossings where Visa on Arrival is available. Those with a Visa on Arrival permit may extend their stay by seven days via the Visa on Arrival extension process, which can be accessed here: Thai Visa Extension. The application can be submitted to any Immigration Bureau office in Thailand. To apply for a Thai visit visa from Pakistan, provide the following documents: - Fully filled and signed visa application form - Passport-sized photographs taken within the last six months with a white background - Proof of accommodation, such as a hotel booking confirmation or an invitation letter from a Thai resident - Financial evidence showing sufficient funds to cover your stay (minimum 20,000 Baht for families and 10,000 Baht for individuals) - Round-trip flight booking confirmation - Visa fee receipt Note that the Royal Thai Embassy may request additional documentation depending on the visa type and application history. Thailand visit visa fees vary by visa type and duration. Here's a breakdown: - Tourist Visa: Single Entry (1,000-2,000 Baht), Multiple Entry (5,000-6,000 Baht) - Visa on Arrival: Single Entry (15 days) (2,000 Baht) - Non-Immigrant Visa: Single Entry (2,000 Baht), Multiple Entry (5,000-10,000 Baht) Processing times vary by visa type and application location. For Pakistani citizens, the average processing time for a tourist visa is 3-5 working days, while the processing time for a visa on arrival can be up to 15 days.
