Starting April 3, 2023, Ohio House Bill 462 allows prosecutors to charge those who deliberately call or text law enforcement with false school threats as a fourth-degree felony. If found guilty, the offender may have to pay back law enforcement fees associated with investigating false threats. Families are encouraged to discuss this new law with their students and report any safety concerns online. The district's anonymous hotline at 844-SAFER-OH can also be used to anonymously report student safety threats. Infinite Campus (IC) is the District's Internet-based student information system, offering features such as Parent Portal and a NEW Mobile App. Parents can access their child's information, designate emergency communication preferences, and manage online payments for food services. Ohio's school safety tip line serves our community 24 hours a day and guarantees anonymity for those who call or text the Ohio School Safety Center. Reporting suspicious behavior is crucial in maintaining school safety, and we appreciate your support. In August, please save this letter if you need to create a new account for IC online.
