To make a search, use the name of a place, city, state, or address, or click the location on the map to find lat long coordinates. Lat Long 0,0 GPS Coordinates 0 0 Just like every actual house has its address (which includes the number, the name of the street, city, etc), every single point on the surface of earth can be specified by the latitude and longitude coordinates. Therefore, by using latitude and longitude we can specify virtually any point on earth. The latitude has the symbol of phi, and it shows the angle between the straight line in the certain point and the equatorial plane. The latitude is specified by degrees, starting from 0° and ending up with 90° to both sides of the equator, making latitude Northern and Southern. The equator is the line with 0° latitude. The longitude has the symbol of lambda and is another angular coordinate defining the position of a point on a surface of earth. The longitude is defined as an angle pointing west or east from the Greenwich Meridian, which is taken as the Prime Meridian. The longitude can be defined maximum as 180° east from the Prime Meridian and 180° west from the Prime Meridian. Both latitude and longitude are measured in degrees, which are in turn divided into minutes and seconds. For example, the tropical zone which is located to the south and to the north from the Equator is determined by the limits of 23°26'13.7" S and 23°26'13.7" N. Or. For example, the geographical coordinates of the mount Ngauruhoe in New Zealand, famous with its being the filming area for the Lord of the Rings movie, has the geographic coordinates of 39°09'24.6"S 175°37'55.8"E. Watch out for mirrors Before leaving the parking lot and getting out on the road is important to adjust your mirrors, your seat position, steering wheel position and of course fasten your seatbelt. Proper 9 and 3 hand position Proper hand position is at 9 and 3, and I guarantee if you drive one-handed at the 12 position you're going to fail your test. It's important to keep both hands on the steering wheel at all times. Of course if you have a manual transmission vehicle you have to take one hand off the ship, but this will keep your test administrator feeling safe and you will be in the most control of your vehicle. Changing lanes When changing lanes is important to do the following: First Signal, then look in your rearview mirror all by your side mirror, look over your shoulder, and if it is safe, then you can go. Once you're in the lane that you're moving into all the way, then you can turn your turn indicator.Always signal if you're changing lanes no matter if there's no traffic around you, is important to check both mirrors, look over your shoulder and use your turn signal. Multiple lanes changing If you're going over multiple Lanes always go from one lane to the next, pause for a little bit of time, then turn your turning indicator on, look at both mirrors over shoulder, go to the next line, pause and then go to the next. Shooting over across 4 Lanes of traffic is a good way to fail the test. Onto a street with a high speed limit Always give yourself plenty of time when pulling out onto a street with a high speed limit. It will not annoy the person providing your test if you wait there until it's safe. If you pull out in front of a car that is moving quickly and do not give yourself enough room you're going to lose points. Waiting until there's plenty of space, more so than you think you would need normally, it is the safe way to do it. Stay in the center of the lane Often beginner drivers tend of fear to one side of the lane or the other. On a single Lane road that means you might been too close to the double yellow or too close to the shoulder. If you need to prevent this there is a technique that you can used that is really helpful when you're learning, is to look farther ahead in the road and try to imagine the center of the road, picture a line in the center of the lane you're in passing through the center of your vehicle. This helps keep you in the center of your lane which is important for succeeding at the driver's test. When coming to a stop sign When you're coming to a stop sign or red light is really important to stop before the white line in the road. That mean, when you're coming to a full stop, you should still be able to see the white line in front of the hood of your car. Then, if it's a blind turn, once you come to a full start, now you can start creeping out a little bit further and further so you can see the flow of traffic and make your right or left turn. Always use a safe following distance between yourself and the car in front of you. The higher the speed limit is, the more the following distance between cars. That is because, if the person in front of you breaks all the sudden, you want to give yourself enough time to react. Braking tips Also, before you break, always check your rearview mirror. If you come onto a stop abruptly and there's a car right behind you, they could run into you. Obviously if it's an emergency situation this isn't always possible, but in the ideal case always check your mirror before braking. Keep your eyes always in movement Always keep your eyes constantly scanning the road for pedestrian, any obstacles or turns that are coming up. That means checking your mirrors constantly: Your rearview mirror, your side mirrors, looking over your shoulder. Being attentive and showing that you're paying attention is going to make a great impression to pass your road test. Cut corners tip When making protective left turns people often cut corners. Is something that everyone does on the road all the time: passing over a double yellow or a white line is a great way to fail your driver's test so make sure to take it wide enough, stay in the guidelines when you're making left turns and not cut any corners. Drive as smooth as possible Always be as smooth as possible. It means smooth braking, smooth steering inputs, smooth acceleration, etc. Being jerky is not going to go well. Drive defensively Drive defensively not aggressively this day is about proving that you are a safe driver not the next F1 star. Prove that on the racetrack. Check the speed limit Obviously don't speed. This is more difficult than it sounds. In general people are used to going 5 miles an hour over the speed limit or so when driving in a daily situation but for the test you cannot do that. Speed limit or below is required. Also having a radar detector in your car for the test if won't be a great idea. Pre-drive checklist: The DMV wants to check if you are proficient with all the controls on the inside the car before you start the driver test. Here's a sample of the pre Drive checklist: The DMV will tell you to turn the car on, but don't start it. Turn the turn signal on to the left and then the right. Turn the headlights on. Turn the windshield wipers on. Turn on the emergency flashers in the morning. The examiner may ask you, if you come out in the morning and there's frost on your front window, how do you defrost your front window? You selected froster, turn the fan on to number 2 or higher and select the "Heat". Any other examiner will ask you to show them your defrosters: Where are they located? The Examiner will then ask you to disengage the emergency parking brake and then, engage the emergency parking brake. They will then ask you to honk the horn. Current vehicle insurance and registration What happens if I do not bring all the required documents for my road test? Failure to provide the required documents at the time of the road test will result in a failed road test. No refunds will be issued to an individual who does not provide the required documents. Individuals under 18 will not receive a refund if a parent or guardian is not present at the time of the road test. Can I bring someone to ride along with me during the road test? If you are under the age of 18 years old, you must have a legal parent or guardian to ride with you for the test. If you are 18 years old and older, no additional people are permitted to ride in the vehicle during the road test. The only exception is a translator if one is needed. Can I rent a vehicle from All Star for my road test? At our Ann Arbor facility, rental vehicles can be arranged for an additional fee. To secure a rental vehicle, you must select this option at the time of enrollment into the road test, or call All Star in advance of your road test to request a rental vehicle. Is Driver Education required for individuals over 18? While no formal Driver Education is required for an adult aged 18 or older, it can be beneficial to receive some form of instruction from an All Star instructor before attempting the road test. Is the condition of my vehicle important when taking the road test? If you plan to use your vehicle for the road test, be sure that it is in good working condition. Your vehicle will have to pass a safety inspection to attempt the road test. You can view the vehicle safety requirements in the Road Skills Test Study Guide. Failure to provide a proper working vehicle at the time of the road test will result in a failed road test. Can I practice at the road test site? It is not legal to practice at the road test site. Does it matter who conducts my road test? Individuals may not attempt the road test with an instructor who has previously provided them with behind the wheel training. Where will the tester take me for my road test? The tester will inform you where your road test will take place on the day of your road test. All Star does not have access to this information. The Road Skills Study Guide provides answers to many questions about the road test. How long does the road test last? The road test lasts approximately 45 minutes to an hour. Is there a limit to how many times a person may take the road test? There is no limit to how many times an individual can attempt the road test. A fee is charged for each attempt, and you must wait 24 hours between attempts. What if I am running late for my road test appointment? It is important to make every effort to arrive on time for your road test. If you are more than 10 minutes late you may be refused the road test, and no refund will be issued. Confirm your road test site well in advance to avoid delays. If it is raining or snowing, do I still have to take my test? Yes, road tests will be conducted if there is rain or snow. A minimum of 24 hours' notice must be provided if you wish to cancel or reschedule your road test. No refund will be issued to an individual who provides less than 24 hours' notice to cancel or reschedule their road test. If conditions become unsafe for a road test to be conducted, you will be contacted and informed by the tester of the cancellation. If I have an interlock device on my vehicle, can I still take a road test? Individuals with an interlock device must take the road test in the vehicle in which the interlock device is installed. There is a required vehicle inspection which is outlined in the Road Skills Test Study Guide. What do I do after I pass my road test? If you successfully complete your Driving Skills Test, the examiner will issue a Driving Skills Test Receipt. The examiner is required to sign it before presenting it to you. The Driving Skills Test Receipt is not a license. To obtain your Temporary Operator's Permit (TOP), you will either visit a Secretary of State branch office or print your TOP by logging onto your online services account on Michigan.gov/SOS. Check your receipt for further instructions. What do I do if I lose my Driving Skills Test Receipt? Please contact All Star Customer Service to request a replacement Driving Skills Test Receipt.
