A famous musician A.R Rahman used to work in his recording studio On September 10th, 2023, A.R Rahman gave a concert in Adityaram Palace City, but people complained about traffic congestion near the venue and VIP tickets they bought for Rs. 50,000 without getting any special treatment. Some girls even said that they were harassed on social media, while police officials said that no complaints were filed officially. In response to this situation, Rahman talked about it in an interview. He stressed the need for world-class infrastructure, increased tourism, and better crowd management in Chennai. Rahman also emphasized the importance of following the rules by the audience. Furthermore, Rahman revealed that they had 46,000 chairs available at the venue but some sections had everyone on one side which led police to think the venue was full and close it. Rahman then went to social media (formerly Twitter) and promised to refund money to those who couldn't attend the concert. A.R. Rahman once had a disagreement with playback singer Suresh Wadkar, mainly because of different working styles. In an interview, Wadkar discussed their issue and said that he sang around 2 songs for Rahman after which they didn't communicate again. In May 2024, Rahman talked about the financial difficulties he faced while setting up his music studio. He said that his mom gave him the first equipment for his studio by selling her jewelry. In the same interview, he revealed that he didn't go to college and enjoyed the company of people in their 40s and 50s.
